
Did you know?

On June 21st, 2018 the Ministry of Environment, in a partnership with MCTI (Ministry of Science, Technology, Innovation and Communications) and INPE (National Institute of Space Research), released the deforestation results of the Cerrado biome, for the period from 2010 up to 2017. The results for 2016 and 2017 are one of the outputs of the FIP Monitoring project.

The results for the official deforestation data for the period from 2010 to 2015 was more refined, which allowed an update of the historical series. This refining generated biennial data for the period from 2000 to 2012, and annual data for the period 2013 to 2017.


The Cerrado biome has 2,036,448 km² of extension. This biome corresponds to 24% of Brazilian territory and covers the states of Goiás, Tocantins, Mato Grosso, Mato Grosso do Sul, the Federal District, Minas Gerais, Bahia, Maranhão, Piauí, Rondônia, Paraná and São Paulo.

Today, the deforested area in the biome corresponds to 6,777 km² and 7,408 km², respectively, representing a reduction of 43% and 38%, both in relation to 2015, as demonstrated in the graphic below.



FIP Coordination

Moving ahead! The project became effective on March 1, 2018. A technical cooperation agreement was signed between FUNATURA (Pro Nature Foundation) and the Ministry of Environment to implement the project.

On June 26, the FIP M&R 2017 report was presented to stakeholders during the workshop held in Brasilia, DF.

FIP Monitoring

Making up for lost time: The Development of Systems to Prevent Forest Fires and Monitor Vegetation Cover in the Brazilian Cerrado project was effective on June 2016. The project had some difficulties in the beginning,

but now the Project Implementation Unit (PIU) is in full operation. The launch of deforestation data in the Cerrado Biome (for 2016 and 2017) during last week, on June 21, 2018 was a great showcase of the project's potential and joint efforts.

FIP Landscape

Good news for the project team! On June 19th, 2018, the SCF Trust Fund Committee endorsed the FIP Landscape project and confirmed the availability of USD 21 million in funds for its implementation. The Project still needs to be submitted to the World Bank Board by September 2018. The project team is advancing with all legal steps and revisions needed to complete the documents required for the project before submission to the Board.

FIP CAR

Taking further steps. A legal instrument between Brazilian Forest Service (SFB) and the Deutsche Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ – GmbH) is being prepared to establish a partnership agreement between the two institutions to develop the project activities.

In addition, members of SFB and GIZ attended the Financial Management and Disbursement Workshop held in Fortaleza and in Foz do Iguacu, to become familiar with the World Bank new rules for acquisitions and accountability processes.

However, the success of the project implementation still depends on the

budgetary resources available for SFB. These resources are defined in the Annual Budget Law (LOA 2018). Currently, the available resources are not sufficient for the project demands planned for 2018.

FIP ABC Cerrado

Spreading knowledge. This initiative promotes capacity trainings in technologies of recovery of degraded pastures, integration of crop-livestock-forest, direct planting system and planted forests. Today, over three thousand producers and technicians were trained on ABC technologies and practices and more than 171,000 ha of land area use sustainable management practices, as a result of the project activities.

The closing date of the project was extended until November 2019.

FIP IFN

Monitoring the Cerrado. The National Forest Inventory is periodically revised to assure an up to date monitoring of the forests and natural resources in Brazil. In the Cerrado area, over 59 million ha have already been analyzed. More than two thousand places in the states of Goiás, Mato Grosso and Mato Grosso do Sul were selected to take part in the most recent inventory process. The inventory of Maranhão, Tocantins, Piauí and Bahia states are almost concluded. The Federal District data was already published.

Time for review! The mid-term review for DGM project included visits to the states of Mato Grosso, Minas Gerais and Tocantins and a complete evaluation of the project's activities and indicators. The purpose was to analyze what adjustments will be necessary to improve the project's implementation.
