**Comments from Germany on the Approval-by-mail of PPCR Funding:
St. Vincent and the Grenadines: Proposal for Phase 1 Funding**

Dear Patricia,

In principal, we agree with the proposal for funding of the PPCR Phase 1 activities in St. Vincent and the Grenadines. However, we suggest that the following points be considered during project design, namely during phase 1:

- The proposed priorities and components do not correspond with the defined focal points for Saint Vincent and Grenadines, as specified in the preliminary regional framework for the Caribbean. Notably the area of watershed management is not mentioned in the proposal.
- Regarding component 1, the socioeconomic factors of vulnerability, gender and children's rights should be regarded more closely - and not only aspects of infrastructure. Important aspects could be the poverty situation, education, land use/access to land etc.
- With regards to component 3, there should be a review on whether a broader approach to integrate climate change in planning procedures wouldn't be more adequate. This should include mainstreaming into relevant sector policies, investment planning and the most important planning approaches on the local and national level. This also concurs with the priority areas defined in the preliminary framework for the Caribbean programme.

Also, regarding our comments to the project proposal for Grenada, I was wondering whether we could please receive answers to our questions/suggestions. I would be most grateful.
