

II: Narrow Transition

Inclusive but focused approach

Social Inclusion: recognizes, includes, and empowers a diverse range of stakeholders throughout transition processes.

Distributional Impacts: considers a narrow range of impacts for specific sectors and stakeholders.

Intention: seeks transformation through inclusive and empowering processes.

1: Systems Change

Inclusive process and broad impact

Social Inclusion: recognizes, includes, and empowers a diverse range of stakeholders throughout transition processes.

Distributional Impacts: considers a broad range of impacts across sectors and stakeholders.

Intention: seeks transformation through the overhaul of systems incompatible with sustainable development and social equity.

III: Incremental Reform

Less inclusive and focused approach

Social Inclusion: recognizes and includes select stakeholders in aspects of the transition process.

Distributional Impacts: considers a narrow range of impacts for specific sectors and stakeholders.

Intention: seeks reform via changes within existing social and economic systems.

IV: Top-Down Transition

Less inclusive process but broad impact

Social Inclusion: recognizes and includes select stakeholders in aspects of the transition process.

Distributional Impacts: considers a broad range of impacts across sectors and stakeholders.

Intention: seeks transformation through consideration of a broad range of distributional impacts.

Adaptive Sustainability




- Inequality, unemployment and poverty

- Urgent transitions that are just (inclusive and fair)
- MDBs and CIF engaged in transition processes (2015-2019 USD 1 billion)

Systemic Change

- A "just transition" could involve demands for shallow change focused on protecting vulnerable workers, or deep change rooted in a vision of dramatically different forms of production and consumption. (Cock, 2011)
- As far back as 2011 NUMSA called for a socially owned renewable sector that achieved service provision, met universal needs, decommodified energy, and provided equitable dividends to communities and workers directly involved in the production and consumption of energy ...
- (NUMSA, 2017)



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



Zoom Settings

• Use the Outline on the right of your screen to easily navigate to specific sections of the Mural board


• To zoom in and out, either use your mouse or the tool on the bottom right of your screen (which also allows you to pan around the Mural board)






Working in Mural

- You can move dots to sticky notes with thoughts you'd like to second, or "upvote"


