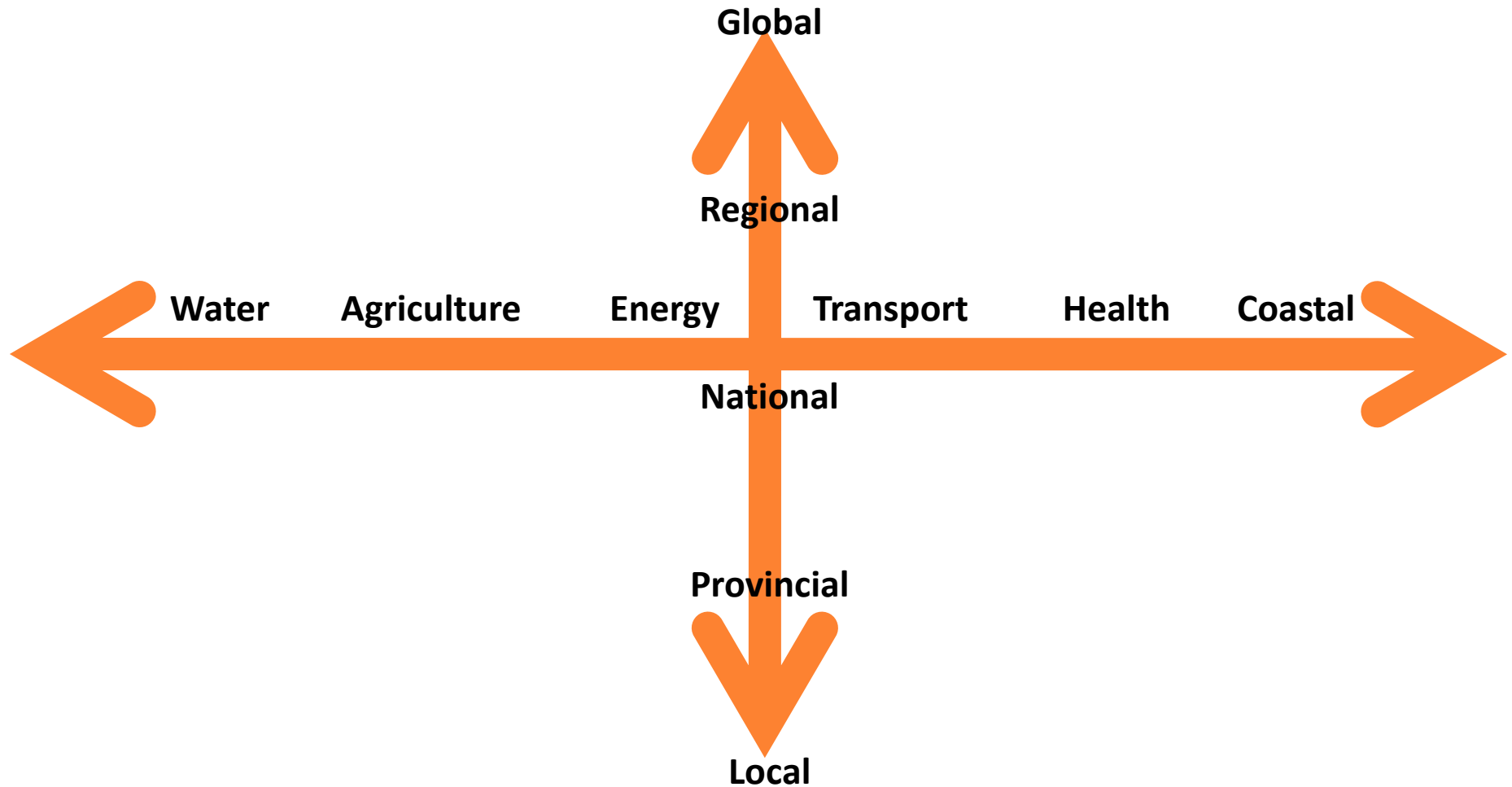
Programmatic Approach

Multi-Sector, Multi-Level Climate Risks and Vulnerabilities

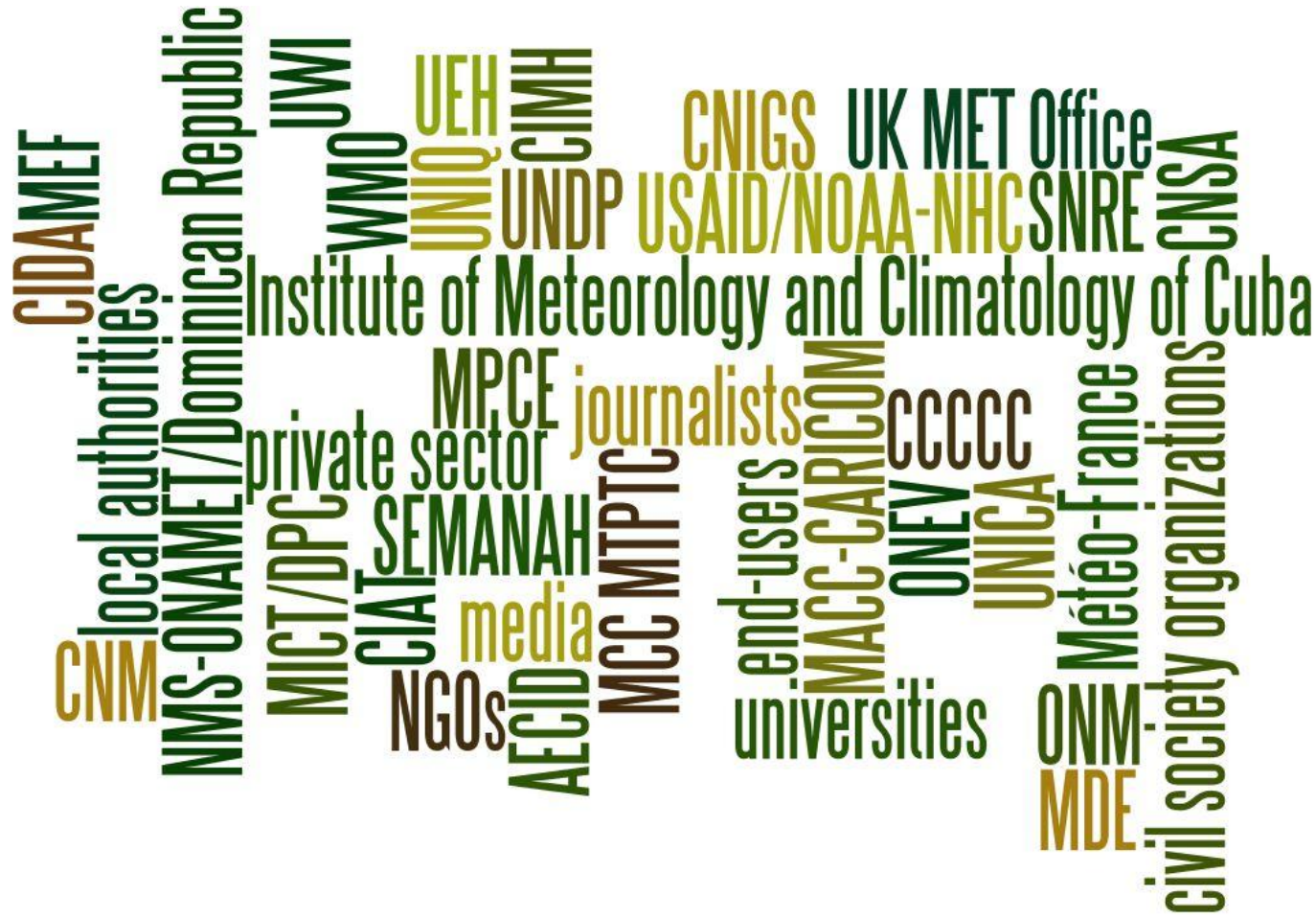
