**Approval by Mail: Proposal for the Use of Additional PPCR Resources:  
Mozambique: Climate Resilience: Transforming Hydro-Meteorological Services  
(IBRD)**

Dear PPCR Sub-Committee Members,

During its meeting on November 1, 2012, the PPCR Sub-Committee agreed to allocate the following additional grant resources to the PPCR pilot countries:

- a. USD 5 million each to Bolivia, Cambodia, Dominica, Grenada, Haiti, Jamaica, Mozambique, Nepal, Papua New Guinea, Saint Lucia, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, Samoa, Tonga, and Zambia;
- b. USD 8 million to Yemen; and
- c. USD 10 million to Tajikistan.

These pilot countries were invited to work with the MDBs to prepare a concept for programs/projects to utilize the additional allocation so as to further advance the objectives of their SPCR.

Consistent with the decision, the CIF Administrative Unit, in collaboration with the MDBs, developed procedures to be followed for accessing the additional resources. These procedures are broadly consistent with the PPCR operational guidelines and were shared with the relevant PPCR focal points on February 1, 2013 (attached below).

We are now writing to share, for your review and approval, a project concept requesting USD 5.0 million in additional grant funding for the project *Climate Resilience: Transforming Hydro-Meteorological Services*. USD 10.0 million in PPCR funding was already approved for this project.

Also attached is the following documentation for your consideration:

- i. the completed request form for the additional allocation;
- ii. a letter from the Government of Mozambique, confirming this request.

The PPCR Sub-Committee is requested to approve the following decision:

**The PPCR Sub-Committee approves USD 5.0 million in additional PPCR grant funding for the project, *Climate Resilience: Transforming Hydro-Meteorological Services*, submitted by the Government of Mozambique and IBRD, bringing the total PPCR funding for the project to USD 15.0 million.**

For your information, the following table summarizes the allocation of PPCR resources for the endorsed SPCR for Mozambique and the additional resources allocated to Mozambique in November 2012. The Trustee has confirmed that there are sufficient resources available for the commitment requested.
