Justification for proposed stand-alone financing in cases of above 7 c or d: The FIP Project provides support to demonstrate effectiveness of REDD+ interventions in both production and conservation forests of West Kalimantan province. If successful, additional support from ADB is anticipated in the future. Originally, the FIP financing was proposed to be blended with a \$4.5 million ADB technical assistance ¹ on sustainable forest and biodiversity management, funded by the Global Environment Facility (GEF), ADB Climate Change Fund and ADB Regional Cooperation and Integration Fund. However, as the GEF assistance had an earlier deadline for processing, the technical assistance project was processed separately and approved by the ADB Board. The FIP project, however, will closely collaborate with the technical assistance project. Thus it may be considered a parallel co-financing to the FIP project.
